# Anglicanism: A History of Living in the Tensions of Unity + Diversity

The three streams of Anglicanism go back to the early church. The Anglican church did not simply begin when Henry VIII broke ties with the Pope when he refused to annual his marriage to Catherine of Aragon.

- Spirit-Filled: After Pentecost (Acts 2), the spread of Christianity found its way throughout the Roman Empire to Britain. Because of the early and foundational history of missionaries like St. Augustine and later St. Patrick, along with such martyrs like St Alban, the Holy-Spirit-led translation of Christianity to other cultures became an important part of British Christianity especially as Britain grew in global influence.
- 2. <u>Bible-Guided</u>: Anglicanism is built around the practice of praying through Scripture daily. At the center of Anglican spirituality is the Book of Common Prayer, a book that takes you through the entirety of Scripture by praying through it. The early influence of Celtic monks brought about this emphasis.
- 3. <u>Liturgy-Formed</u>: Because of the catholic influences, Anglican Christianity has not severed its ties with the historic and universal catholic practices of liturgy and the church calendar. The British Church sent delegates to the Council of Nicea in 325 AD, when the Nicean Creed was adopted.

# The Prayer Book: A Middle Way Through Communion
